

It is the most artistic walk up the stairs to Badger class currently where the children's wonderful war art is displayed. The children have used chalk, paint and collage to create silhouettes of WWII London. In maths, the Year 5 children have been developing their knowledge of decimals using tenths and hundredths, whilst the Year 6 children have been converting and ordering fractions, decimals and percentages. In English, the children have been studying the genre of a diary, working our way towards applying the taught features in their own war diary. In Science, we have been researching the seven life processes. In History we have been sequencing Hitler's rise to power and learning the key events that led to

him being the Fuhrer (leader).

We have continued our learning about plants this week by checking on our root viewers to see what had grown. We then investigated leaves, thinking about how they help the plant to stay alive, and went out to find a huge variety of leaves in our school grounds. In English, we discussed the features of a biography, and in maths, Year 3s have started adding and subtracting fractions, while Year 4s have been learning about decimals.

Going forward we will be monitoring attendance closely to ensure that we are hitting the targets given to the school by the DFE.


